**Rahul K. Gairola, Ph.D. (University of Washington, U.S.A.)** is Assistant Professor of English and Comparative Literature in the Department of Humanities & Social Sciences (HSS) at the Indian Institute of Technology Roorkee. He is the author of *Homelandings: Postcolonial Diasporas and Transatlantic Belonging* (London and New York: Rowman & Littlefield International, September 2016) and co-editor (with Amritjit Singh and Nalini Iyer) of *Revisiting India's Partition: New Essays on Memory, Culture, & Politics* (New Delhi: Orient Blackswan/ Washington, D.C.: Lexington Books, June 2016). He is currently working on two contracted book projects: the first critically re-thinks shifting meanings of "home" in digital identities and cultures of 21st-century India and its diasporas, while the second examines gender and home economics in recalibrated kinship relations of migrants from rural regions of Garhwal to urban metropolises in northern India. He is an Article Editor for *Postcolonial Text* (Open Humanities Press), and co-editor, with Roopika Risam, of the "Digital Humanities and South Asian Studies" special issue of *South Asian Review* (Fall 2018). He has attended a number of digital humanities symposia, lectures, and events, and was also a recipient of an invitation grant to the Digital Humanities Oxford Summer School (DHOxSS) 2017 and a German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) Scholarship recipient for the 2017 European Summer University in the Digital Humanities (ESUDH) at the University of Leipzig.
